Introduction

All forms of Motor Sport are inherently dangerous, to participants, spectators and organisers. Here at Dalton 4x4 Offroad we have designed management systems to ensure, so far as reasonably practicable, that everyone enjoys their off-road experience and returns home safely and without injury.

To assist with your visit, it is vitally important to read, understand and comply with these written guidance and regulations below, but also to include any different actions described

at the time of your visit, which take into account any immediate changes necessary on the day.

Failure to comply will invalidate your booking.

- 1. **All drivers** participating must have a **current UK Driving Licence** for the type of vehicle being used, and must have a **valid Certificate of Insurance**.
- 2. Your vehicle must be suitable for the event and have a **current MOT Test Certificate** that covers the date when you will visit Dalton 4x4 Offroad.
- 3. On arrival at the venue, all participants must report to Reception and register before attempting any part of the course. A Course Guide will brief you on the prevailing conditions for the Course/Zones to ensure you have been given current guidance for the Course(s)/Zone(s) you intend using.
- 4. Pedestrians/Spectators are allowed out of the vehicle for the purpose of photography and/or videoing, but the Course/Zone surfaces are uneven and often very slippery. Great care must be taken to avoid vehicles, slip/trip hazards and terrain edges during these times. Appropriate footwear must be worn by all extra-vehicular participants. Assume the worst that the course will be muddy and slippy.
- 5. **A short Public Footpath passes through an area of the site**. This will be identified to you at the Registration process in Reception and when you approach the area during your trip. **In the rare event that a member of**

the public will use this footpath when the event is underway, all driving activities adjacent to the footpath must stop until the area is cleared.

Your Guide will give appropriate advice at all times.

- 6. Camping Areas are available on request. Vehicular movement is prohibited in these areas, and at this time no portable BBQs must be used (We do have fire pits available for hire and logs for sale).
- 7. Welfare facilities are available on site. Only well behaved, controlled dogs are allowed on site. Dog fouling is unwelcome and owners must clean up after their dogs and use the available disposal bins.
